Medicated Dewormer Species Label Notification

In December 2018, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration requested that animal drug companies revise the labels of drugs intended to treat certain internal parasites in livestock and horses to add information about antiparasitic resistance. This move comes as a result of the agency's work with veterinary parasitology experts and the animal health community to find ways to maintain the effectiveness of these drugs.

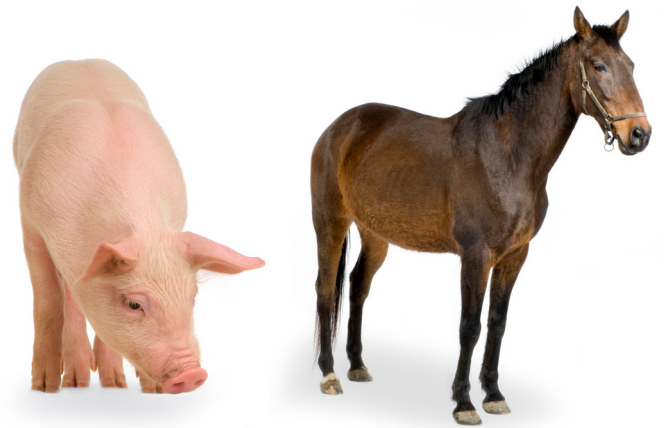
The new labeling information emphasizes that proper dosing is critical to the safe and effective use of a dewormer and end-users should work with their veterinarian to monitor herds and flocks to determine the extent of antiparasitic resistance on a particular farm.

The Safeguard 0.5% fenbendazole manufactured by MarSyt carries a multi-species label for equine, cattle, swine, growing turkeys, zoo and wildlife animals listed on the label.

It is not labeled for species such as sheep, dogs, cats, potbellied pigs, goats, deer, rabbits, pet lizards, chicken or other backyard fowl.
